

Why are so many people moving to Cook Island?

The country has since reopened, but its economy has declined by 25 percent. These challenges are contributing to mass migration, with four out of five Cook Islanders moving overseas, often for higher-paid jobs. Dozens of houses now sit abandoned in villages across the islands.

Where do most people live in the Cook Islands?

Most of the Cook Islands people live in the Southern Islands. Two largest Islands are Rarotonga (main island) and Aitutaki The Government of the Cook Islands has a long standing policy commitment of 100% renewable electricity by 2020.
