

What is chemical energy storage?

This section reviews chemical energy storage as it relates to hydrogen, methanol, and ammonia as the energy storage medium. Many chemicals used for energy storage, like hydrogen, can decarbonize industry and transportation.

The most prevalent forms of chemical energy storage in use today are liquid hydrocarbons, electrochemical, such as reversible batteries, biomass, and gas(e.g., hydrogen and methane).
