

Who imports Russia's natural gas?

Similar to crude oil and condensates exports, OECD Europe was the largest regional importer of Russia's natural gas, accounting for nearly 75% of Russia's total natural gas exports. Germany, Turkey, Italy, Belarus, and France received most of that natural gas.

How does Russia make money from oil & gas exports?

The majority of Russia's crude oil and condensate exports went to OECD Europe, which received almost half of Russia's total exports. However, at a country level, China imported the largest volume of Russia's crude oil and condensate exports in 2021.

About 60% of Russia's oil exports go to OECD Europe, and another 20% go to China. In November, the latest month for which official monthly oil statistics are available, OECD Europe imported a total of 4.5 mb/d of oil from Russia (34% of its total imports), of which 3.1 mb/d was crude oil and feedstocks and 1.3 mb/d oil products.

Combined, those 5 leading exports collected 37.8% of Russia's total revenues collected from selling all its exports on global markets. The total dollar amount for Russia's top 100 exported consumer products increased by 59.3% from 2021 to 2022 and expanded by 85.3% over the 5-year period since 2018.

Table 1 provides an overview of how EU-Russia energy trade changed from 2021 to 2023. The drop in EU energy imports from Russia (excluding uranium products), from about 14,000,000 terajoules to 2,000,000 per year, represents a drop from 26 percent of the EU's primary energy consumption in 2021 to 4 percent in 2023.

**Russian Gas Exports in 2023** In 2023, Russia exported an estimated 142 bcm of gas, down sharply from around 244 bcm in 2021. This included about 99 bcm of pipeline gas to Europe, FSU countries, and China, and around 44 bcm of LNG globally (see Figure 1). Exports to Europe (including Turkey) still account for slightly under half of Russian gas ...

Russia exported more than half of the coal the country produced in 2021. Russia's coal exports in 2021 increased by 7% to 262 million short tons (MMst). China imported nearly 25%, or 63 MMst, while South Korea, Japan, and Taiwan together received about 22% of Russia's coal exports. One-third of Russia's coal exports were sent to OECD Europe.

Most of this decline involved pipeline gas supplies to Europe (-120 billion cubic meters [bcm]).

Since Russia's invasion of Ukraine, many countries have pledged to end or restrict their oil and gas imports to curtail Moscow's revenues and hinder its war effort. The Russian economy is highly ...
