

How many pieces of poetry does Jiu Zhang have?

"Nine Pieces" ("Jiu Zhang") consists of nine piecesof poetry,one of which is the "Lament for Ying" ("Ai Ying"). Ying was the name of one of the traditional capital cities of Qu Yuan's homeland of Chu (eventually,Ying and Chu even became synonymous).

Does Chinese poetry have ancestors?

If we must speak of ancestors in this context, then Chinese poetry has a single ancestor--the Shi jing --with a profoundly influential descendant--the Chu ci --that dramatically expanded the range of literary possibilities from the Han period onward. As a postscript, I would like to conclude with a poem.

Does the Chu Ci show a dual ancestry of Chinese poetry?

Speculation aside, I submit that the Chu ci does notprovide evidence of the "dual ancestry" (Hawkes) of Chinese poetry.

Where did Chinese poetry come from?

Having originated from folk songs, the Chinese poetry has produced a large number of brilliant examples from the Western Zhou Dynasty (1046-771 BC) to the Chunqiu (Spring and Autumn) Period (770-476 BC). China has, since ancient times, maintained a tradition of education in poetry, which is used to educate the people and arouse their intelligence.

What is Chu ci poetry?

Chu ci includes varying metrics, varying use of exclamatory particles, and the varying presence of the luan(envoi). The styles of the Chu Ci compare and contrast with the poems of the Shi Jing anthology (Book of Songs, or " Song" style), with the typical Han poetry styles, and with Qu Yuan's style in The Lament.

Are Chu Ci and Shi Jing poetics related?

There are still many unresolved questions regarding the origins and early history of the Chu ci. What is clear is that the southern culture hypothesis cannot account for the complex relationshipbetween Chu ci and Shi jing poetics.
