

What is compressed air energy storage?

Compressed air energy storage (CAES) is one of the many energy storage options that can store electric energy in the form of potential energy (compressed air) and can be deployed near central power plants or distribution centers. In response to demand, the stored energy can be discharged by expanding the stored air with a turboexpander generator.

Which energy storage technology has the lowest cost?

The "Energy Storage Grand Challenge" prepared by the United States Department of Energy (DOE) reports that among all energy storage technologies, compressed air energy storage (CAES) offers the lowest total installed cost for large-scale application (over 100 MW and 4 h).

How is high-pressure air stored?

The high-pressure and high-temperature air is cooled before being stored in an air reservoir. The thermal energy can be dissipated into the atmosphere, stored in TES, or used for heating applications. In the discharging process, stored high-pressure air is released whenever the electricity is required.

What countries use compressed air?

Buenos Aires, Argentina, used air pulses to move clock arms every minute. Starting in 1896, Paris used compressed air to power homes and industry. Beginning in 1978 with the first utility-scale diabatic CAES project in Huntorf, Germany, CAES has been the subject of ongoing exploration and development for grid applications.
