



What is energy storage & how does it work?

Today's power flows from many more sources than it used to--and the grid needs to catch up to the progress we've made. What is energy storage and how does it work? Simply put, energy storage is the ability to capture energy at one time for use at a later time.

Why is energy storage important?

For example, electricity storage is critical for the operation of electric vehicles, while thermal energy storage can help organizations reduce their carbon footprints. Large-scale energy storage systems also help utilities meet electricity demand during periods when renewable energy resources are not producing energy.

How can energy be stored?

Energy can also be stored by making fuelssuch as hydrogen, which can be burned when energy is most needed. Pumped hydroelectricity, the most common form of large-scale energy storage, uses excess energy to pump water uphill, then releases the water later to turn a turbine and make electricity.

Does energy storage provide backup power?

Energy storage can provide backup powerduring disruptions. The same concept that applies to backup power for an individual device (e.g., a smoke alarm that plugs into a home but also has battery backup), can be scaled up to an entire building or even the grid at large.

What is solar energy storage?

Solar energy storage is a system that includes photovoltaic cells for collecting the energy of the sun connected to a battery or bank of batteries.
